Dear Members,

Hereit appy New Year to All! I know we are excited for a new year and looking forward to many fun events coming up in 2022. Last year proved to be both a very challenging, yet successful year. Although we experienced many difficulties with supply

chain issues and staff shortages, financially the Club had another positive year in 2021. Below is some information to share as we close the books on 2021 and look toward the future.

Memberships - We had a total of 85 new memberships in 2021, including 62 new Country Club members (property owners) and 23 new

Invitational members (non-property owners). Our total membership is now up to 649, with 485 of those made up of Country Club and Invitational members. And, we have now reached our cap of 50 Invitational memberships set by our BOD. Obviously, we now expect membership turnover to slow down versus what have realized over the past 2 years.

F&B News – Chef Tom Donnelly has announced his departure from Coosaw Creek. I would like to offer a big Thank You to Tom for coming on board at the end of 2020 to help lead our F&B operations and Club. Chef Tom took over our kitchen operations during our busy holiday season last year. He helped navigate an extremely challenging time for us at times with only two employees in the kitchen. We are thankful for his hard work and efforts, as well as his leadership over the past year. And we wish Tom all the best in the future!

With that said, I am pleased to introduce Steve Manall as our Interim Head Chef. Chef Steve comes to us from the Charleston Place Hotel where he served as Chef de Cuisine for over 10 years. He was originally hired as our Sous Chef in September, but with the departure of Chef Tom, we are happy to give Steve an opportunity to lead our culinary team. Chef Steve has brought great passion and a renewed energy to our kitchen staff. He has already added some great weekly specials. And we are excited to try his dishes and see his new menus.

Drainage Repairs - We finished 2021 with

work beginning on two Club drainage repair projects. One of the repairs has been completed which was the internal banding of a faulty joint in the 24" RCP drain line located under the fairway of hole #16. The other drainage repair project is the dig and replace of a 24" CPP line located behind the pond on hole #3, adjacent to Club Course Drive. Excavation work has begun on this

project, but the repair is not expected to be completed until later this month.

Splashpad – The most exciting project we are currently working on is the addition of a new 1400 square foot splashpad at the pool! Demo of the "old" kiddie pool has been completed, which will be the location of the new splashpad. The new features have been ordered and installation will begin once the features are delivered. If everything goes according to plan, we expect to have the splashpad up and running prior to the start of the swim season in early spring. We look forward to this exciting new amenity for our Coosaw families to enjoy.

Please excuse our work on these projects. On behalf of the Club and Staff, we'd like to thank our members for a successful year at Coosaw Creek! 
Hole in One Club - Policy

Instruction Corner

Instructional Tip of the Month – Long Bunker Shots

Most golfers understand the concept of executing a basic greenside bunker shot: You want to swing through the sand, under the ball. But when it's a longer bunker shot of 20 to 40 yards, the fatal mistake I see is swinging harder to try to hit the ball farther. Do that and you usually end up taking too much sand and leaving the shot well short. Instead, follow this checklist.

First thing to do is to take a less lofted club, the longer the shot the longer the club. Do not be afraid to use a less lofted club just remember to open up the face before you take your grip. Secondly aim closer to the ball, instead of hitting a few inches behind like you would in a standard bunker shot try to hit just about an inch behind the ball. Third you need to make a full turn to generate enough power to propel the ball all the way there. Finally maintain your knee flex, doing this will help ensure the club glides through the sand under the ball, don't just chop and stop, keep swinging through. A high finish will help loft the ball into the air and send it the distance you need. So try these four things and you should see improvement in your long bunker shots.

Course Update

Christmas has come and gone, we hope everyone had a fantastic holiday with family and friends!

Course conditions are very good as we hit our mid-winter mark in January. Greens are in great shape for this time of year, but we must stay on top of things even though we are in winter dormancy. It is imperative that we manage moisture on the putting surfaces closely, too wet and we could create anaerobic soil conditions (lack of oxygen) which in turn could cause turf loss, too dry and we could desiccate (complete lack of moisture) which would cause turf loss as well. We have the ability to manage VWC (volumetric water content) through the use of wetting agent products that can be applied through our Toro boom sprayer. These wetting agents, once sprayed, will help drive moisture through the soil profile down to the root zone where it is most needed. If we go through dry periods we can run the overhead irrigation for a few minutes to help prevent any possible desiccation.

band in the drainpipe that runs down the middle of 16 fairway. This was needed due to a separation in the pipe joints which caused the subsidence approximately 75 yards out from the green. Now that we have this in place, we will sod cut around the sink hole area, level and sod back taking out the current "dip" that has been present. This project will more than likely take place in early spring once we can get some warmer weather in the forecast to allow the sod to properly root into the soil.

We will also continue to work on leaf control as we switch gears to make that our top priority until they have finished falling. Our method of cleanup is typically to blow the leaf debris into the rough, then come behind and mulch them with the mowers. This is our most efficient and effective way to handle such a large amount of leaf debris, since the vast majority of the golf course is lined with trees that produce falling debris.

We hope that everyone has a great start to the new year, as always please remember to fill your divots and fix your ball marks!



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FACILITY USE

The Coosaw Creek Country Club amenities include the Swimming Pool and Pavilion, Tennis Courts, Basketball Court, Golf Course and Clubhouse. We encourage all of our members to take advantage of the various fun activities and facilities available to them. To assure a safe and enjoyable and safe experience for all it is important to note the following guidelines:

18 HOLE PAR 71 ARTHUR HILLS CHAMPIONSHIP GOLF COURSE - Winds through beautiful low country wooded wetlands surrounded by community homes. Golf Pro Shop hours are 7AM-7PM everyday.

During golf play hours of 7AM to dusk only Pro Shop authorized golfers and the Club maintenance staff are allowed on the course and cart paths.

Personal golf carts, skate boards, bicycles or other personal motorized vehicles are not permitted on the course or cart paths at anytime.

Dog walkers, permitted before or after golf hours, must carry and use pooper scoopers and keep pets off of tees, fairways, greens and bunkers.

The course is open for public play daily, but all play must be approved by the proshop prior to beginning on the course.

Any unapproved play, practice or abuse observed on the course may result in suspension of Club privileges and/or fines.

GOLF PRACTICE FACILITY

The Practice Areas are open during normal Golf Course hours except for posted regularly scheduled maintenance times. Practice areas include the Driving Range, Chipping Green, Practice Sand Bunker, Putting Green and teaching area.

Teaching is provided exclusively by the Coosaw Creek Professional Golf Staff.

All practice must be approved by the Pro Shop staff.

Range balls and bags are the property of Coosaw Creek Country Club and shall not be removed from club property.

Proper Attire is the same as for the Golf Course.

COOSAW CREEK COUNTRY CLUBHOUSE is Coosaw

Creek's community center featuring full service dining, Bar, Meeting Rooms and Pro Shop. In addition to supporting the many social functions of the Members, the Clubhouse banquet facilities are available to Members and the public for meetings, parties, weddings and other celebrations. Take-out and call ahead service is also available.

CLUB ATTIRE

Quality denim or golf shorts are allowed in the clubhouse unless specified otherwise for special events. For all evening dining events after 5pm, men must wear a collared shirt and caps are not allowed in the dining room. Shoes and shirts must be worn at all times. Cover ups must be worn over Swim attire.

TENNIS/REC COURTS

Two regulation Plexipave lighted tennis courts and a basketball court are available to Members only:

Tennis courts are strictly reserved for tennis.

Tennis play is on a first come, first served basis until 11:00pm

Appropriate apparel and regulation tennis shoes are required for play on the tennis courts.

SWIMMING POOLS

Open from Memorial Day Weekend until Labor Day Weekend, the Swimming Pool is staffed with lifeguards during published hours and is available for open swim (at your own risk) when lifeguards are not present.

Please observe and follow all rules posted in the pool area. All instructions from pool staff and/or lifeguards must be obeyed.

All Food or Beverages must be purchased from the Club, unless prior approval has been obtained from the General Manager.

Pool closes at 9:00 PM except for special events.

PONDS

Coosaw Creek's beautiful ponds have been stocked with fish - but beware of snakes, alligators and other



wildlife.

The course ponds are part of a larger low country wooded wetland area. Please respect this incredible asset and avoid contaminating it with any foreign materials or liquids.

Fishing is allowed only from the bank and only in designated areas. These areas have been selected to ensure that people fishing are not in the normal flight of golf balls and that ponds can be approached without crossing the course or using the cart paths. They are located:

- POND BEHIND THE PLAYGROUND Approach from McChune Court
- HOLE 15 Approach from Arthur Hills Circle
- HOLE 16 Approach from Club Course Drive
- HOLE 17 Approach from Power Line Break

Fish in course ponds are for "catch and release" and not for consumption – a major disappointment to our chef!



These guidelines are established to ensure a positive experience for all Members and guests who use the facilities. Enforcement is the responsibility of all members and staff of the Club. A polite reminder is usually sufficient, but should it become necessary to report any violation please call the Pro-Shop or the Club General Manager.
